

EDWARD JAMES SCHMELTZ 1949 - 2022

The PIANC family lost one of its dearest members with the passing of Ed Schmeltz on 9 March 2022. His contributions to the civil engineering profession, the global maritime industry, and to PIANC were significant, and he leaves a legacy that we could all be proud of. A native of Chatham, New Jersey, Ed graduated from the New Jersey Institute of Technology (NJIT), with a BS in Mechanical Engineering, and then earned his master's in civil engineering from Texas A&M. with a specialty in Coastal and Ocean Engineering.



Ed contributed his expertise on a global stage, with major projects in 21 states, 37 countries and 6 continents. He worked

on US Navy shipyard projects at Kings Bay (GA), San Diego (CA), and Pearl Harbor (HI), and international projects in Qatar and Panama, to name just a few. He found time to serve our profession, garnering the prestigious OPAL Award in Design from ASCE, and was a Founding Member of the Coastal, Oceans, Ports and Rivers Institute (COPRI).

Ed joined the PIANC USA Board of commissioners in 2013, serving until 2021. For PIANC International, he served as Vice President, Americas, and Co-Chair of the Coordination Commission, bringing his talents to a global stage. PIANC is a stronger organization today because of Ed's selfless and meaningful contributions.
